



We provide the knowledge and skills which people with diabetes require to take control of their health.

- Individual diabetes education
- · Self blood glucose monitoring

- Outpatient insulin starts to avoid hospitalization

### False

These can both be signs of type 2 diabetes (raised blood sugar due to inadequate production of insulin, or your body's inability to use it properly). Other signs include frequent infections, cuts that won't heal, blurry vision, unexpected weight loss, passing lots of urine.

### 3) True

Over the long term, uncontrolled raised blood sugar levels can have a very serious effect on health. However, once you know you have diabetes it is nearly always possible to keep your levels under control with a combination of diabetes education, diet change, exercise and weight control, blood sugar testing and medication.

### (4) True

Over time, high blood sugar can cause the blood vessel walls to thicken and become less elastic - this causes poor circulation, especially through fine blood vessels, which can affect other organs and bring about diseases such as kidney failure, heart disease and blindness. Quitting smoking will also help reduce these risks.

### 5) True

People with diabetes have a much greater heart disease and other risks. If you have diabetes you should have regular check ups with your doctor to help keep other heart risks, such as high blood cholesterol and high blood pressure, under control. Anyone with diabetes is entitled to a free check up once a year.




