## **BNA's Recycling Program**

BNA's recycling program has 2 main categories. Please separate recycling into:

- 1. Containers (Cans, Metal, Plastics& Glass)
- 2. Paper& Cardboard

## Notes:

- Use clear or blue recycling bags so grounds staff can identify bag as recycling.
- All items in the recycling must be clean without food residues
- DO NOT PUT GARBAGE IN RECYCLING! Even if 1 item is dirty or not an accepted item the entire dumpster may become contaminated and disposed of as garbage.
